General Assembly • Executive Committee Meeting

The latest General Assembly and Executive Committee meetings were held in Jerusalem on Thursday and Friday 14-15 March 2013. Members of the Executive Committee and the General Assembly met at the David Citadel Hotel, in Jerusalem. Also attending were the EFP governing body, the Chairmen of the committees, the EFP representatives and the board representatives from the national societies (63 people in total).

The President, Moshe Goldstein, opened the meeting by welcoming all the representatives of the National Societies and

>> thanking the members of the Executive Committee and the EFP Secretariat for their support during his year of Presidency.

The Secretary General, Stefan Renvert, informed that a Strategic planning meeting held in London in January 2013, pinpointed the need to take action and execute the previously identified objectives such as the restructure the GA format, the review and update of EuroPerio guidelines, the engagement of young people and restructuring of the EC to a smaller more focused group.

A new format was proposed for the GA and served as a pilot to be tested in Jerusalem. The GA was divided into two parts: a. Reports from the President, Secretary General, Treasurer and Chairmen of the standing committees as well as of the activities carried out by the EFP during the year (morning session), b. and working groups (afternoon session). Four working groups were formed namely "Specialty", "Media and Communication", "Approach and involvement of the Young Generation" and "Congresses and EuroPerio". The idea was to more actively engage the national societies for their input on key issues through this interactive format. The Specialty group identified benefits such as a better health for the population and the protection of the public as well as drawbacks, such as the fear of the GPs to lose patients. The "Media and Communication" group proposed to actively involve EFP representatives giving them specific tasks. They would prepare a structured document for them with the highlights of the GA immediately after the meeting, to be presented at their national society board meeting. It was also suggested that EFP should be in the social media: Twitter and Facebook to improve communication with the public and the GPs. Professional help on this will be needed.



The group pointed out that some EFP societies are weak in communication and organisation and need more EFP support. It was also suggested to involve the industry in spreading the message "Perio for a better life"

The group for the Involvement of Young Generation proposed asking national societies to identify "young future officers" who fulfil clear criteria: working in the Perio field, active as academic or private practitioner, having experience in national boards and having interests / abilities in one of the committees. Details of these valid candidates should be presented to the Executive Committee.

The Congresses and EuroPerio group proposed the restructure of the committee incorporating new people with congress experience and the set up of a 6-member committee. Also EuroPerio guidelines need to be updated and guidelines for other EFP meetings such as the Master Clinic should be prepared. Discussing the EuroPerio concept it was stressed there should be no fear for the EuroPerio to grow as it is an important asset of the EFP and that the Federation should move forward. Iain Chapple stressed that it is time to financially invest in delivering the key aspects of strategic planning. The Strategic Planning Executive, H&K, 9th European Workshop on Periodontology, Media campaign and the External Affairs Committee have all been busy in the last few months. Last year the Treasurer and SG identified a need to invest in communication with GDPs and the public. In line with this Ann Moulson has been working as scientific writer for the 9th European Workshop on Periodontology outcomes. Javier Garcia (media advisor), Marianne Steinbeck (PR and media), Fernando Morales (designer of the webpage), Peter Wix (provider of website content) and Monica Guinea (link with the national societies) are heavily involved in the EFP media campaign.

Before ending his term, Iain Chapple introduced Joerg Meyle to the GA as the new very knowledgeable Treasurer of the EFP, and thanked the EC members and Monica Guinea for their support during these years. The social events were exceptionally organized by the Israeli Society of Periodontology and Osseointegration, with the professional assistance of Mrs Orit Gurman and Mrs Tali Levi-Yosef from Ofakim Travel &Congresses LTD. A memorable day trip to Galilee was arranged and sponsored by MIS. This included a visit to Tabgha, the Church of the Multiplication of Loaves and Fishes and the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter. This was followed by a visit to Capernaum, the town of Jesus, and then the Annunciation Church and the Nazareth Bazaar. The Welcome dinner at the "Harp of David" located on Mount Zion close to King David's tomb, Dormition Abbey and the Old City, was sponsored by Dexcel Ltd., manufactures of "Perio - Chip»; and the dinner at "Beit Shmuel" cultural center designed by the renowned architect Moshe Safdi as part of the Mammilla project, was sponsored by MIS – Implants Technologies Ltd. Both dinners were thoroughly enjoyed by all for the special ambiance and exceptional view of the "Holy City".

The President closed the GA by thanking the Executive Committee for their reports and the EFP coordinator, Mrs Monica Guinea, for the

substantial work done in the organization of this GA. He also expressed EFP's gratitude to the Israeli Society of Periodontology and Osseointegration for their generous hosting of this meeting.

It was a long and very productive meeting. Nairn Wilson, past Dean and Head of King's College London Dental Institute, accepted his appointment as EFP Strategic Planning Executive and started working on the Recognition of the Specialty at European level, as well as updating and developing the EFP Strategic planning. Stefan Renvert presented the updated Strategic planning for the years 2013-2017.

Iain Chapple reported on various financial issues and achievements: EFP has a new legal address in Belgium at Burotel, 4 Rue de la Presse, Brussels 1000. A new domain name efp.org was bought by Edwin Winkel. The EFP partners Dentaid, P&G, Sunstar and J&J have renewed contracts with the EFP. Other important issues covered were the appointment of Mr. Stephen Degraef as EFP accountant, and the excellent support of David Lipton as EFP Auditor was acknowledged. Also, Hill+Knowlton Strategies have been engaged to assist Nairn Wilson facilitate the Recognition of Specialty of Periodontology by the EU.

Among other priorities of the Committee, Chairman of the External Affairs Committee, Edwin Winkel, discussed the redesign and restructure of the website, the search for a PR officer or Media person to enhance communication, with dentists and the public, to disseminate the outcomes of the EFP & AAP Perio Workshop. (Through the website – Tiernan O' Brien and the newsletter – Joanna Kamma). Also discussed were the update of the EFP members e-mail database by Birgitta von Troil; the start-up of the Delphi Study by Phoebus Madianos; and the set-up of the three EFP annual awards proposed by Ubele van der Velden.

Message from the EFP President



My dear colleagues,

I took part for the first time at an EFP General Assembly in 2002 and I was impressed by the work that has been done throughout these years. In 2010 I became an EC member and I had the privilege of taking part in important discussions and the opportunity to better understand the inner workings of this wonderful institution.

I am happy to be part of this team, comprised of representatives from the various committees, the Executive committee members, and Monica, our European coordinator; all of whom are passionate, effective people.

We had a very interesting meeting in Jerusalem organised by Mosche Goldstein, our most recent President, and I would like to sincerely thank him for the work he did this year and for the brilliant organisation of those two unforgettable days. I thank him also for his visit to Brussels when the Belgian Society of Periodontology invited him to be a juror at our « research presentation » meeting in December.

During the GA, the different committee reports were presented. An important change to notice is that after 4 years of serving as treasurer, Iain Chapple retired from his post and Joerg Meyle will take his place. My warm and heartfelt thanks go to him for always finding a way to provide the EFP with financial stability. We are indebted to Ian who is moving on to lead the research committee. Joerg has great experience and Ian is totally confident in him.

The GA was different this year and gave a more active role to the participants. Four groups were formed with different topics: one for « the specialty », a second for « media and communication », a third for « the engagement of young members » and the last one for the « EuroPerio and congresses ». The discussions lasted for more than an hour and the final result was presented to the GA. I really believe this new concept of working in groups during the GA is a very good opportunity to communicate and exchange ideas between members.

The EFP website is in constant evolution and is an excellent source of information. Edwin Winkel has obtained a new web address which is www.efp.org. and is more appropriate for the EFP. Tiernan O'Brien went to Gothenburg to visit Jan Lindhe and recorded a video with him that was one and a half hours long. « In truth, I could have recorded ten times that; such is the breadth of his experiences in Periodon-tology » said Tiernan. It is called the « EFP channel ».

Videos from the last EuroPerio in Vienna are also available, as many of us found it difficult to make a choice between so many interesting conferences, we now have the opportunity to review them on the website. The access is reserved for the participants of EuroPerio only. Joanna Kamma is doing very good work with the Newsletter, which now has been edited into Pdf format and transformed into the page-turn effect electronic version. This issue was primarily dedicated to EuroPerio7. The EFP News Flash is an online newsletter with posts, mini interviews, important breaking news with a few lines of description and then a "read more.." option. Societies.

Perioworkshop.org is a new website reporting the results of the Perio workshops. Mariano Sanz is still organising those European workshops « de main de maître » and the next one will be dedicated to « periodontal plastic surgery and soft tissue regeneration ».

Mauricio Tonetti, JCP 's editor, has introduced a new concept on the site : podcasts featuring commentary on articles by the author. Francis Hughes is the very active organiser of EuroPerio 8 , he has already done a lot of good work and the event is on a is headed in a great direction. Jean-Louis Giovannoli who is responsible for the congress committee, presented the « master clinic » project, it will be held the 7th and 8th of February 2014 in Paris. The theme of this congress is « peri-implant plastic surgery and reconstructive surgery ». The number of participants is limited to 500 and the registration will be open on Monday the 16th of September 2013. The program seems to be very attractive and is dedicated to Perio specialists. Ubele van der Velden reports for the postgraduate education committee, and this year the perio program for the Paris 7 University has been approved. I personally wish to congratulate Philippe Bouchard and his team for this recognition. Korkud Demirel, who is responsible for the under-graduate training, made an instructive survey about the education given in all European dental schools. Unfortunately not all the schools answered and I encourage everyone who didn't answer to do so. I t is of great importance that undergraduate students receive valuable training in perio.

Phoebus Madianos is the new EFP vice-president and started a Delphy Study Perio in 2012. This study will enlighten us on the trends of periodontology in the future.

The EFP family is growing and Poland become a new full member, Two new associate members are Lithuania and Ukraine.

A new section has also been created: international associate member, and India is the first of these. I welcome them all and I am sure we will have a fruitful collaboration together.

Pierre Baehni received an award for his long and significant contribution to the EFP, Pierre thank you very much for all you have done for us. Michel Brecx and Gil Alcoforado started together at the EFP and this year was their last participation. We thank you for your contribution all these years.

Croatian Periodontology on its way to the European Union



Croatia applying for the membership of the European Union (EU) in 2003, had to undergo changes in the science and health sector, along with the changes in the judicial, governmental, financial and political sectors, in order to meet the requirements of the European Council and the European Commission.

Until recently, Periodontology has formed part of a "triple" dental specialty (Dental and Oral Pathology with Periodontology). After its separation, Periodontology has slowly emerged as one of the most important and widely known specialty in Croatia. Currently, there are only six dentists practicing Periodontology. However, there are eight more dentists following the long and difficult process in becoming Periodontologists.

All Member States, by October 2007, should adopt the Directive of the Recognition of the Professional Qualifications (2005/35/EC). Therefore, Croatia must also adopt it into its National Legislations by a negotiating process that was initiated in the autumn of 2005. In addition, Croatia accepted and signed the Bologna Declaration. In the academic year 2005/2006 Croatia started the new and reformed curriculum of the dental medicine study that will span a six year period, amounting to 360 ECTS.

Concurrently, the University of Zagreb has started reforming the dental specialist education. The postgraduate education in periodontology is being reformed according to the guidelines of the European Federation of Periodontology (EFP). The national periodontal scientific society of Croatia has become an associate member of the EFP.

It is obvious that Croatia is a long way from obtaining an approval of the EFP-Education Committee, but the steps taken already position the country close to the expected levels of graduate and postgraduate education in the EU. The academic dental community of Croatia is faced with the challenge, since it is responsible, to recognize and set the goal of achieving European level of education. It is difficult to achieve, but with the help of the EFP, it seems achievable and realistic.

Profile



Graduate Programme in Periodontology and Implant Dentistry at the Academic Centre of Dentistry Amsterdam

The graduate programme in Periodontology and Implant Dentistry at the Academic Centre of Dentistry Amsterdam (ACTA) is a 3 year full time programme (in English) and is EFP accredited. This programme is both clinically and scientifically orientated and enables the successful postgraduate student to practice periodontics and implant dentistry at the specialist level.

Calendar

The academic year starts on the first Tuesday in September and will end in the beginning of July. The weekly programme is on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 8.00 to 18.00 and on Wednesday from 8.00 to 19.00.

Clinical performance

During the first and second year the students are responsible (under supervision) for the diagnosis and treatment planning of about 480 newly referred periodontal patients, seen at the policlinic of the department during $\frac{1}{2}$ a day per week. In addition the 1st year students will spend 2 days per week on treatment of their own patients, which is focused on initial periodontal therapy.

In the 2nd year, the students treat their own patients during 2,5 day a week. The treatment is focused on periodontal surgery and implant dentistry, specifically for the periodontal patient.

In the 3rd year, the students treat their own patients during 1,5 day a week. The treatment is also focused on periodontal surgery and implant dentistry, specifically for the periodontal patient.

In addition the 3rd year students will have a mandatory internship of 9 months of 1 day a week in an accredited private periodontal practice.

Throughout the programme 1 hour per week is reserved for the students to present and discuss the diagnosis and treatment planning of their own patients as well as the progress of the treatment. During the programme, the students are required to complete about 25 fully documented periodontitis cases (from intake through maintenance). Of these, 10 will be selected for presentation to the board of examiners; at least 2 of these 10 includes implant dentistry.

Seminars and literature review

In the didactic part of the programme, half a day per week is dedicated towards education in theoretical knowledge of periodontology and implant dentistry by means of seminars. All seminars are a combination of a presentation of a topic by the teacher and a discussion on the basis of 8 to 10 relevant articles given in advance. Furthermore in the first year an extensive course is given in Oral Biology. In this way the whole scope of periodontal literature is covered.

Scientific training

During the whole programme one day a week is dedicated to research. The students are required to develop their own research project in line with current projects being carried out in the department of periodontology or in a relevant collaborating department. The project may be either clinical research or basic research in a laboratory and leads to a written report amenable for publication in an English-language international refereed scientific journal. In addition, the students are trained in scientific writing by means of a comprehensive literature review.

In the programme, time is allocated for a course in Evidence Based Dentistry as well as statistics.

Furthermore, during the whole programme 2 times per week a 1 hour session is dedicated to training in critical analysis of the literature by discussing a wide range of current articles.

Graduate Programme in Periodontology and Implant Dentistry at the Sahlgrenska Academy at the University of Gothenburg



Description of the postgraduate training program in periodontology

The Postgraduate program is a full-time 3-year program and will enable the successful postgraduate student to practice Periodontics and Oral Implant Therapy at a specialist level. Along with the development of technical skills, the graduate must acquire a thorough understanding of the biology and functions of the human tissues and the science of periodontology. Furthermore, the postgraduate must be able to understand and critically evaluate the periodontal and related literature. Additional aims are to give the postgraduate exposure and training in teaching and research.

THE SAHLGRENSKA ACADEMY AT UNIVERSITY OF GOTHENBURG



Clinical literature seminars: Weekly seminars are held with evaluation and discussion of the scientific literature within various areas of clinical periodontology and implant dentistry, as well as interrelationships between periodontics and endodontics, orthodontics, and prosthodontics. A written summary report is required from each seminar.

Research

Seminar series will be given on e.g. literature search, scientific theory, ethics in medicine, design and methodology in experimental and clinical research, writing research protocols, statistical methods/data analysis, presentation of research data and scientific writing.

Each student should undertake a research project. The results of the project should be presented in the form of a written report amenable for publication in a peer reviewed international journal. The research project should be finished and presented together with a literature review of the research field for the Board of Examiners.

Program Director is Assoc. Prof. Ingemar Abrahamsson and Chairman of the Department is Prof. Jan L. Wennström.

Other members of the staff are: Prof. Tord Berglundh, Assoc. Prof. Per Ramberg, Assoc. Prof. Kajsa H Abrahamsson, Dr. Anna Bogren, Dr. Björn Cassel, Dr. Jan Derks, Dr. Mauro Donati, Dr.Kerstin Schander, Dr. Sara Thorbert Mros, Dr. Cristiano Tomasi, Dr. Maria Welander and Dr. Angela Wennström.

Admissions

The applicant must (i) have earned a DDS or equivalent degree, (ii) have acceptable academic records and references and (iii) have a minimum of two years of clinical practice in general dentistry. In addition, proficiency in oral and written English is mandatory.

Calendar

The curriculum comprises 6 semesters (3 academic years) of full time studies (1,640 scheduled hours per year). The spring semester starts in January and finishes last week of June. The fall semester is from September through December. The weekly schedule includes 50% of clinical training, while the remaining time is used for seminars, case presentations, courses, research and library studies.

Clinical Performance

The clinical practice is managed in a specialist clinic for periodontics. The postgraduate will be responsible for the treatment of about 120 – 150 patients with various periodontal problems. The student will perform non-surgical as well as surgical therapies. The surgical therapies include access surgery, osseous surgery, muco-gingival procedures, crown lengthening, reconstructive procedures and implant placements. The clinical practice is not limited to periodontics and implant dentistry. Also prosthetic therapy, tooth as well as implant supported, will be performed when indicated. Weekly case presentations are carried out, in which one of the students will present 2-3 cases for discussion of treatment strategy and the treatment carried out, together with the group and members of the faculty. At the end of the program the student is required to present 30 fully documented periodontal cases.

Seminars and literature review

Group seminars: Courses on various aspects of periodontology and odontology in general are given. The sources of knowledge will be research articles and well-substantiated clinical evidence.

Clinical courses: A number of practical courses will be given on the clinical management of patients with various forms of periodontal problems.

5th International Stomatological Congress - Ukrainian Society of Periodontists



On 11-12th April 2013, the 5th International Stomatological Congress "Clinical periodontology- vision into future" took place in Ticher's Building (Kyiv). This event was organized by National Medical Academy for Postgraduate Education (NMAPE) named after P.L. Shupyk and the Ukrainian Society of Periodontists (USP). It should be emphasized that this congress was organised according to the EFP patronage for the first time. The congress program was published on the official EFP web-site two months in advance. During the EFP GA meeting in Jerusalem, USP became an Associate Member of the EFP and this event was significant for USP and all society's members. It should be emphasized, that among all CIS countries only Ukraine and Lithuania are members of the EFP.

In the congress program were included different dental professionals who are famous all around the world and are in the field of periodontology. They were professors from Europe: prof. Pierre C. Baehni (Switzerland), prof. Korkud Demirel (Turkey), prof. Giedre Matuliene (Switzerland), prof. Jolanta Pytko-Polonczyk (Poland), ass. prof. Darko Bozic (Croatia), and also professors from Russia: prof. L. Orechova, prof. A. Grudynov, prof. A Shchipsky, and from Byelorussia – prof. N.Udina.

Famous Ukrainian professors were also participated in the main congress program. Among them were: prof. G. Biloklytska (Kyiv), prof. A. Borysenko (Kyiv), prof. O. Denga (Odessa), prof. I. Mazur (Kyiv), prof. A. Politun (Kyiv), prof. Y. Chumakova (Odessa). EFP President Elected, Dr. Michèle Reners (Belgium) was invited as honorary congress guest to come to Ukraine for the first time. 

International EFP Membership



EFP Website Update



EFP is now investing quite a considerable amount of money and personal resources with the aim to get Periodontology accepted as an official specialty within the EU. Nairn Wilson, EFP Executive Director with the consultation of Hill + Knowlton Strategies has had direct contact with key Members of the European Parliament (MEPs), MEP supporters and country representatives at the Council of Ministers. This has allowed him to closely follow the procedure and a make a strong case for the

Dr. Wilson will be lobbying to ask for the inclusion of Periodontology in the list of recognised specialties. There is a strong resistance from the European Council of Dentists, one of the stakeholders of the process. The strategy recommended is to lobby with the other stakeholders: governments and European parliaments. Iain Chapple encouraged national societies to approach the MEPs and ask for support. Nairn Wilson will take over liaison with the EFP members and lead on the preparation of the response to the anticipated consultation. Sören Jepsen is preparing a statement document to demonstrate that Perio is a major problem. This paper will be used for the recognition of the specialty.





Delphi Study Perio EU 2025 Delphi Project

The Delphi study organized by EFP had the objective to analyze the trends in Periodontology in Europe by 2025. The specific objectives were:


- To analyze trends in periodontal and periimplant health in Europe in 2025
- To analyze trends in periodontal research and publications in 2025.
- To analyze trends in periodontal training (graduate, postgraduate and continuing education) by 2025.
- To analyze trends in practising periodontics in Europe by 2025.

The Delphi method has been used, specifically the method based on expert opinion to achieve a consensus. A structured questionnaire, developed by a "technique" group of 6 experts, was answered by a group of experts from different parts of Europe. Two levels of representation were considered: the first level corresponds to all the countries that belong to the European Federation of Periodontology and was assisted by experts from 25 European countries. For the second level of representation, the countries were grouped according to their Oral Health Care System. Five system models have been considered: Nordic model, Bismarkian model, British model, Southern model and Eastern model. Overall, 121 European experts were invited to participate, belong-ing to 3 possible profiles: Academia, Private Practice and Public Health sector.

A first round of questionnaire circulation and data collection was completed in March 2013. The answers were analysed before a second round of data collection (April 2013) was performed. In the second round, the experts had the opportunity to review and possibly change their answer taking into consideration the results of the first round. A question that received the same answer by at least 75% of the experts was considered to have reached a consensus. The analyses were made at "model level" for all questions, except for tendencies in publications, that was made at a European level.

A second analysis will be performed, followed by a consensus conference, which will eventually lead to the final report of the Delphi study.

The Publication Committee had, on behalf of the EFP, negotiated a contract with the publishers Blackwell/Munksgaard. The proposal was sent to all Member Societies. The Secretary General asked each Member Society to express its opinion on the contract proposal. All Societies agreed to approve the contract, provided Blackwell/Munksgaard would make an introductory offer of approximately €80.00 for the year 2003 print subscription. The Secretary General asked all Societies to approve this contract in their respective General Assemblies in order to fully implement it in January 2003.

This year, the University of Leuven, Belgium became the seventh to have its Post Graduate programme accredited by the Post-Graduate Education Committee.

The Croatian Society of Periodontology was accepted as an Associate Member of the EFP.

Declan Corcoran reported on the formal meeting between the EFP-Executive Committee and the AAP board during the 87th AAP Congress in Philadelphia 6-10 October, 2001. During this meeting both executives agreed to organise a common scientific session either in EuroPerio or in AAP Meetings happening in the East Coast. The EFP formally invited an official AAP Delegation to take part in the 4th European Workshop on Periodontology in Ittingen 2-6 February, 2002. The president also reported on the successful EFP session celebrated in Philadelphia.

Diabetes, Oral Health and Nutrition: Inter-relationships, Innovations and Interaction

On September 20th, 2013, for the second consecutive year the link between diabetes and oral health has been investigated in an international seminar in Europe under the auspices of the Joslin Sunstar Diabetes Education Initiative (JSDEI), bringing a unique interdisciplinary approach to diabetes – a metabolic disease affecting millions of people across the world. This symposium in Milan, Italy, welcomed Diabetologists, Endocrinologists, Periodontists, Dentists, Dental Hygienists, Nutritionists and post-graduate students from all over Europe with an engaging scientific programme.

Consisting of an audience of approximately 300 international experts, the speakers of the symposium 'Diabetes, Oral Health & Nutrition: Inter-relationships, Innovations & Interaction' reiterated the issue of diabetes, underlining the importance of several inter-related factors that must be considered in order to decrease the risk of diabetic complications.

The symposium was organised by the Sunstar Foundation (Japan) and the Joslin Diabetes Center (USA), the world's pre-eminent diabetes research and clinical care organization with the support of Sunstar and the partnership with the FDI (World Dental Federation). Accreditation support was provided by the SIdP (Italian Society of Periodontology), AIDI (Italian Dental Hygienists Association) and SID (Italian Society of Diabetology).

As highlighted by the speakers, the starting point of an interdisciplinary approach is the awareness of the connection between diabetes and periodontitis. Actually, periodontitis has been linked with worsening glycaemic control in people with diabetes as well as with increased risk for diabetic complications including coronary artery disease (CAD), renal disease, and increased mortality. On the other hand, periodontal disease is an infectious complication of diabetes. Consequently, in case of poorly controlled diabetes, the patient will be at a greater risk for severe periodontal disease. Therefore, it is of paramount importance to develop practical screening strategies in order to treat patients from the different perspectives. According to the lecture of Robert J. Genco, Distingui-





shed Professor of Oral Biology and Microbiology at the State University of New York at Buffalo, 'Current Understanding of the Association Between Periodontal Disease and Diabetes Mellitus', the treatment of periodontal disease in patients can improve glycaemic control, possibly by improving insulin sensitivity. Consequently, it is fundamental to include management of periodontal disease in the complete care of patients with diabetes.

Development of hyperglycaemia in type 2 diabetes is the result of the concomitance of predisposing, precipitating, and accelerating factors, and the mechanisms of diabetic complications are complex and related to periodontal diseases. This is what emerged from the presentations by George L. King, Professor of Medicine at the Harvard Medical School and Director of Research, Joslin Diabetes Center, Boston, 'Mechanisms of Diabetic Complications: Role of insulin resistance and hyperglycaemia', and by Stephano Del Prato, Professor of Endocrinology at the University of Pisa, Italy, 'The pathogenetic complexity of type 2 diabetes'.

From the symposium it was evident that genetic background plus an environment with calorically dense food and sedentary lifestyle have led to worldwide epidemics of type 2 diabetes and obesity. C. Ronald Kahn of the Joslin Diabetes Center, Livio Luzi, Professor of Endocrinology at the University of Milan and Maurizio Tonetti, Executive Director, European Research Group on Periodontology (ERGOPerio) investigated the interplay between lifestyle, insulin resistance and periodontal diseases, and stressed the importance of correct nutrition

and physical activity in order to decrease insulin resistance and hyperglycaemia. High fat, high glycemic index and low anti-oxidant content diets impair insulin action. On the contrary, positive lifestyle changes have an immune-modulation effect, activating intracellular signaling pathways and leading to improvement of insulin resistance.

In conclusion, as periodontitis in poorly controlled diabetics can lead to severe complications, it is necessary that periodontists, dentists and dental hygienists are involved in treating diabetic patients together with the diabetologist, nutritionist and the general medical practitioner to complete the multidisciplinary approach in modern day patient management. In this context, dental specialists must not only treat periodontal diseases, but also inform patients about the importance of nutrition, weight reduction and physical activity. Moreover, they must play a specific role in identifying patients who are at risk for diabetes because a dental referral to a physician could provide an opportunity to contribute to early diagnosis and early intervention.

The European Periodontal Community will be saddened to learn of the death of Professor **Jan Egelberg.** Jan was awarded his Doctorate from Lund University, Sweden in 1967. His talent for research resulted in him becoming Professor of Periodontology at the Dental School in Malmö and at the relatively young age of 37 years. His early research focused on host/parasite interactions a subject still relevant today. Jan's visionary approach to periodontal therapy, which included a focus on nonsurgical treatment and periodontal regeneration, led to many papers that in no small way shaped the modern treatment of patients. He had a particular ability to harness the enthusiasm of young aspiring researchers. His meticulous approach to the conduct of research was inspiring to those fortunate enough to have been mentored by him. His international reputation led him to be headhunted by Loma Linda University where he spent the bulk of the second half of his career. However, he did not abandon Europe and actively sought young European talent to spend time in Loma Linda. Many present European researchers benefited from his guidance in this manner. Citations of his work continue to be found in abundance. His love of teaching led him to be an early enthusiast for an evidence base to Periodontics. This enthusiasm, in turn prompted his authorship of text books which used a novel form of literature appraisal. For those of that knew Jan not only professionally but also as a friend, his integrity, generosity of spirit and loyalty will be missed enormously.

Dr Anne Haffajee



Personal memories of an English Rose and a wonderful lady

It is with great sadness that I write this short personal memory of yet another great clinical scientist lost to the global periodontal community. Anne Haffajee passed away peacefully on Friday the 16th August in Boston, following a long battle with cancer; she was only 65 years old. It is almost 2 years exactly, give or take 11 days since we lost Sig Socransky, Anne's great colleague and mentor. Anne was a true Brit, born in Colchester in 1947; she studied at University College Hospital London, graduating in Dentistry in 1970. Anne's husband Charles is an exceptional Cardiologist and Anne moved to Boston with Charles in 1976, where she joined the Forsyth Institute and worked for decades with Sig, changing the face of periodontal microbiology and making a truly distinguished contribution to clinical periodontology. Anne's work was justly recognised by the award of "Distinguished Scientist" of the IADR.

Anne had a sharp intellect, a great sense of fun and above all she enjoyed life, managing to achieve all she did, whilst at the same time bringing up a family and maintaining a work-life balance. I met Anne in 1992, during my first visit to the Forsyth Institute, which at the time was on the Fenway in Boston. It was very clear during our discussions in the lab that Anne remained at heart very British, whilst appreciating and enjoying her chosen career and life in the USA. We laughed about the dreadfully narrow English country lanes that she hated driving through now, after so many years of US highways and freeways and we discussed skiing in North America. Anne was an expert skier and enjoyed the double black runs of Europe and the most challenging black runs of North America. Two of my fondest memories of Anne are very different ones. The first was in 1995, when the Forsyth team were preparing abstracts for the AADR, and of course being British, I had quietly helped some of the team with their abstracts, prior to Anne and Sig's scrutiny. Anne came into the lab one morning and summoned me over, to announce with a wry smile on her face, that I'd been rumbled, because I had spelled several words in "English English" rather than "American English"; she was the only one in the lab capable of solving that mystery. The second was dinner at the IADR in Singapore 1995, when Anne joined me and my colleagues from Birmingham UK and completely outclassed themale contingent with her knowledge of English football, and her ability to drink beer and remain elegantly sober until the evening ended.

However, besides being a very patient, wise and caring person, who mentored many young scientists from all over the globe, especially South America, Anne will always be remembered for her glittering career in clinical science. She leaves behind her two daughters and husband who meant the world to her, and she leaves the world of periodontal research and care a poorer place for her passing. Quite simply, Anne was a brilliant and a lovely person.

Thank you Anne for the science, and for just being you.
